Dear Parents, Guardians and **Men** of the Instrumental Music Department:

Please read this entire letter for important information about concert attire.

A **Concert Tux Uniform** is provided by North Farmington High School Music Department for use during all performances unless otherwise indicated. The school provides the all black tuxedo jacket and pants, a bow tie for a \$20 Uniform Cleaning fee, and the student should provide:

- White Tuxedo Shirt -If your student does not have a Tuxedo Shirt from last year, or it no longer fits, the Boosters will measure your student and order a new shirt for \$18, or there is a limited supply of gently used and cleaned shirts available for \$8 each.
- Plain dark socks
- Black shoes
- Percussion students typically wear a black vest in lieu of the Tuxedo Jacket.

If needed, the Tuxedos can be professionally altered for an additional \$10 fee. Arrangements for alterations may be made during uniform fittings. Jackets and Pants should **never** be cut or adhesively hemmed.

A signed (parent/guardian & student) Uniform Contract, and payment is required at fitting. You may pay that evening with cash, check (made out to NFHS B & O Boosters), or with a Credit Card or Paypal online at the fitting. Or, you may pay on the Boosters Website, and bring your signed contract and emailed receipt as proof of payment. Go to www.nfhsmusic.org/uniforms

This year Concert Uniform Fittings are scheduled on:

- Wed. Sept 5th 5-8pm, primarily for Juniors and Seniors
- Thurs. Sept 6th 5-8pm, primarily for Freshmen and Sophomores
- Thurs. Sept 13th 5-8pm, for anyone who missed the first two fittings
- Some students may be fitted during music class. In this case a signed contract is still required, and an invoice will be sent home with your student. Payments and contracts may be returned to the Boosters box in the rehearsal room.
